GENERAL CONFERENCE POSTPONED

On March 3 it was announced that once again General Conference has been postponed until 2024. The reason given by the Commission on General Conference was because of the inability for some delegates from other nations to obtain Visas

The postponement of General Conference will cost the United Methodist Church nearly three million dollars. The vote on the protocol will be delayed four full years. The result of the postponement, the Global Methodist Church: (a conservative church with traditional biblical conservative values.) has announced that it will launch on May 1, 2022. Since our last General Conference there have been 200 United Methodist churches that have already disaffiliated from the denomination. Why begin the Global Methodist Church May 1? Because this date is before any Annual Conferences meet this spring. it will allow each Annual Conference the opportunity to respond. What do we need to do? At this point we do not need to do anything but pray and seek the direction of Heritage United Methodist church and all United Methodist Churches. We need to continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of people's lives.
