Moms Helping Moms Diaper Drive

Mothers living in poverty A cause you can cannot afford to purchase an really get behind. adequate supply of diapers for their infants or toddlers. Some must choose whether to buy diapers, food or medications. This is further com-



plicated by the fact that diapers cannot be purchased with food stamps or WIC.

An inadequate supply raises health concerns for the little ones. Furthermore, it makes it very difficult for a parent to work because most daycares require the parents to provide an adequate supply of disposable diapers. Mothers who cannot afford an adequate supply of disposable diapers turn to the Western Pennsylvania Diaper Bank for assistance.

The diaper bank is the only regional nonprofit organization focused solely on the distribution of diapers to families of low-income or poverty level in Westmoreland and surrounding counties. Community diaper drives are essential to acquire an adequate number of diapers.

Heritage Church will hold a diaper drive throughout the month of May as we celebrate Mother's Day. We will be collecting packages of disposable diapers (especially sizes 4, 5 & 6, any brand) and/or wipes to help supply the emergency. A receptacle is located at the top of the stairwell to receive your donations.

Media Update

Over the past month, you might have noticed an improvement in the overall look of our livestream output. This is due to a recent upgrade, adding two mounted cameras that can pan and tilt,



and a switcher for operating them from the rear of the sanctuary. This enables us to video from multiple locations and angles. It is also integrated with the sound system to provide better sound quality to the livestream. With the help of the sound technicians, we have been in the process of fine-tuning and improving the overall output of the livestream. The main purpose of livestreaming is to make the services available for people who cannot make it to church due to for people who cannot make it to church due to health or weather or other personal reasons.

Until now, we generally only livestreamed the early church service, but that will vary from week to week according to needs. If you have an interest in the process of livestreaming our church services and you think you might like to help the media team, please contact the office or Ashley Berkebile. He will be happy to show you the new system and how to use it. If you are only curious at this point, you may sit beside Ash during a service and observe the process. It is relatively easy to learn and operate. Additional helpers could make it possible to livestream either of the morning services and also the Saturday evening service on occasion. Any help would be welcome!

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Ones,

Now that Easter has been celebrated, attendance often drops and some people have asked "Why do you insist that I need to attend a local church when I get tremendous enjoyment in attending different churches or watching services on TV?" I wanted to take a few moments to share some thoughts regarding the importance and value of faithfully attending a local church. You may know of more reasons, but for now here are a few.

- 1. It is a place to call "home." "Home" is usually where the "rubber meets the road". We get to know our "family" and they get to know our strengths and weaknesses, and as "iron sharpens iron", we become stronger both in the short and long term.
- Accountability and Encouragement A home church becomes a place for accountability, and also is a great place for receiving encouragement from brothers and sisters in our family.
- 3. It is a place to get involved with a ministry on a consistent basis. As part of a community of believers, there is something powerful about having the

faithful, consistent witness of a person in ministry not only in the good times, but also in the tough times. Impressionable children and youth often look up to those in ministry as examples for their own lives as they are young, and to be remembered and followed as they grow older.

4. Most Pastors want to know what home church a person attends when they are asking for a place to minister in the church or community. To most pastors, this shows a teachable and servant spirit. In watching over the flock under their care, they are careful who speaks into the lives of the congregation.

5. It gives the local Church stability for more effective and impactful ministry. The church knows who can be depended upon for financial and ministry support. If everyone moved from church to church or stayed home to watch TV services, there would be no opportunity for effective ministry whatsoever, and churches would have to close the doors due to lack of faithful attendees. And this is currently what is happening in our towns, cities and nation! We all should be deeply concerned about these behaviors.

Well, these are just a few reasons for the value of consistently attending a local church and no doubt there are many more. I trust these will be of assistance to you as some may ask you this question I often am asked!
