Dear ones,



We have been studying the book of James on Sunday mornings and we have talked about trials that come into our lives.

There is one dimension of trials that I did not address. In 1 Peter he tells us that when difficult trials come into our lives it can bring grief. Grieving is an important human emotion. God created us with the capacity to grieve. Jesus demonstrated the depths of human grief as he stood before the tomb of his dear friend Lazarus. We are told by John that Jesus wept. It is right for us to grieve when pain and death and suffering enter into our lives.

Jesus sent the Holy Spirit, the Comforter to encourage us during these times. If there was no grief in the lives of Christians then Jesus would not have had to send the gift of the Holy Spirit. Solomon tells us in Ecclesiastes 3:4 "There is a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance." When Peter talks about trials in 1 Peter Chapter 1 the word that he uses is a word for trials that are undeserved, unexplainable and that which comes from without rather than within our spiritual being. These trials come from many different forces and forms.

With these trials comes a very legitimate expression of grief. To deny grief is only to exaggerate the pain of the trials. Please know that tears are a good expression of our trials even though we have a God who helps us through them. Sometimes the best thing we can do is to have a good cry and later the Holy Spirit promises he will bring joy back to our lives.
