Instead, God speaks to give us application of His Word to specific circumstances in our lives. When we get too busy to pray, we open ourselves to making bad decisions. May we stay connected to God in these busy days.




pantry. Beth Caldwell took this photo of Mike Yeskey and Brian Bloom having fun making pancakes.
