#### Dear Ones,

Each year, as Lent approaches, many Christians find themselves asking what they should "give up for Lent." Though it is not mandatory for a Protestant believer to do so, it has become a tradition in many denominations to fast or abstain from something (food, vices, or other daily enjoyments). Some congregants have asked where this idea came from. There's a popular theory that because Christ gave up His life that we, too, should give something up. Another notion is that because Lent is often a time for reflective prayer and meditation that fasting should naturally take place. But truly, where did this idea come from? We can turn to the Old Testament and see an example in Daniel:

'Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes." -Daniel 9:3

In ancient times, it was common to fast following the death of a loved one; Jesus said that fasting would be appropriate for believers once he died. In the verse above, we see Daniel fasting out of concern for Judah and, later on, after receiving a mysterious vision. Spiritual fasting involves denying ourselves the natural desires we have (for food, for vice, for other daily enjoyments as stated earlier) so that we turn to God to fulfill our needs: God meets our hunger, satisfies our cravings, and becomes what we long for. Here's what Jesus had to say about fasting:

"so that your fasting will not be noticed by men, but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."-Matthew 6:18

If you choose to fast in any form or facet, it should be between you and the Lord, not on parade to show "how spiritual you are." However, if you have any questions about fasting, partial fasting, or fasting during Lent in particular, feel free to get in touch with me about any questions or concerns that you may have.

# Letter to the Congregation - from the Information Team

Dear Members of Heritage Church,

The Information Team has been working behind the scenes to gather documents, research information and comply with the requirements set forth to pursue the Disaffiliation Process. It has been a learning experience as we all continue down this path. We want to keep you informed as to the plans and the time-line involved.

Our team has divided into two groups to make the process as smooth as possible and to split the work involved. The first group is focused on the UMC Disaffiliation Process as specified by the Conference and includes Rich Ziegenfus, Ron Wagner, Greg Schaetzle and Tom Shearer. The second group is focused on the Affiliation Process and what avenues are open to us after disaffiliation, if the second congregational vote reveals that a 2/3 majority still wishes to disaffiliate. This group includes Larry Barth, Dan Fritz and Ryan Glista.

The disaffiliation group has a meeting scheduled for Feb 14 with the Conference Board of Trustees in Cranberry to finalize our financial commitment. Two professional real estate appraisers were engaged to assess the property value for the church building and the parsonage in preparation for that meeting. The results of those appraisals have been accepted by the Conference Trustees in preparation for the meeting. This acceptance has resulted in a significant reduction of the 2% payment on our property value. We have scheduled a Congregational Meeting for March 15 at 7:00 pm to explain the Disaffiliation costs, process, and timing and what the next steps are. That informational meeting will then be followed by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Congregational vote scheduled for April 16, at 1:30 pm.

Meanwhile, the Affiliation group has been exploring possible future options for Heritage Church, such as becoming an Independent Church, associating with another Wesleyan denomination such as Free Methodists, or joining a new denomination such as the Global Methodist Church.

The team met with Rev Chris Whitehead of Charter Oak Church on Jan 18 to learn more about the Global Methodist Church. Rev Whitehead is serving on the Transitional Leadership Team for the newly formed Allegheny/West Conference of the GMC. This area is comprised of Western Pa and Ohio.

The Affiliation group will present options and provide the pros and cons of the most likely and compatible affiliations at an informational Q&A Congregational Meeting to be scheduled on May 3.

A vote as to which option to pursue is tentatively scheduled for May 10. All activities are designed to be completed in time for the UMC Annual Conference, which takes place June 14-17. It is at this conference that a final formal approval is given to all churches who have elected to disaffiliate from the UMC.

The time-line below is for easy reading and for marking the dates on your calendar. Exact dates and times will be provided when confirmed.
