Note From The Pastor &



I am sometimes asked a question which might go like this: "Why do you insist that I need to attend a local church when I get tremendous enjoyment in attending a different church often?" We live in a day which offers the message of the Gospel to the Sinner, and inspiration to the Christian in a vast variety of ways such as the internet, radio, television, cd's, MP3 files, and on and on it goes! Well, I wanted to take a few moments to share some thoughts regarding the importance and value of attending a local church. You may know of more reasons, but for now here are a few.

- 1. A place to call "home" "Home" is usually where the "rubber meets the road". We get to know our "family" and they get to know our strengths and weaknesses, and as "iron sharpens iron", we become stronger both in the short and long term.
- 2. Accountability and Encouragement A home church becomes a place for accountability, and also is a great place for receiving encouragement from brothers and sisters in our family.
- 3. Pastoral Care We all encounter times of crisis such as sickness, deaths, divorce, family events, as well as times of joy such as marriages, job promotions, etc. It's wonderful to share these events with our families, and of course, it's always so comforting to have the local family of God surrounding you with prayers and support.
- 4. A Storehouse for regular Tithes/Offerings Where would the local church be without regular Tithes and Offerings from it's members and adherents? Basically, wasting time with fundraiser after fundraiser to fund the church ministries. Tithing was commanded "before" the giving of the law, and was never stopped at the time of Christ even though the opportunity was there.
- 5. A place to get involved with a ministry on a consistent basis As part of a community of believers, there is something powerful about having the faithful, consistent witness of a person in ministry not only in the good times, but also in the tough times. Impressionable children and youth often look up to those in ministry as examples for their own lives as they are young, and to be remembered and followed as they grow older.
- 6. Respectability and Acceptance in ministry endeavors Most Pastors want to know what home church a person attends when they are asking for a place to minister in the church or community. To most pastors, this shows a teachable and servant spirit. In watching over the flock under their care, they are careful who speaks into the lives of the congregation.
- 7. Gives the local Church stability for more effective and impactful ministry The church knows who can be depended upon for financial and ministry support. If everyone moved from church to church, there would be **no opportunity for effective ministry** whatsoever, and churches would have to close the doors due to lack of faithful attendees.

These are just a few reasons for the value of attending a local church and no doubt there are many more. I trust these will be of assistance to you as some may ask you this question I often am asked!

And, of course...there's always this powerful scripture from the Word in Hebrews 10:25 (NKJV) 25 Do

not forsake the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

Heritage Votes to Disaffiliate

A journey that began July 20, 2022 with an Informational Meeting culminated in a final conclusive congregational vote on April 16, 2023 for Heritage Church to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. Of the 100 voting members present, 85 voted in favor, 14 not in favor and 1 vote abstained. District Superintendent Paul Ritchey, who conducted the meeting, explained prior to voting that according to Roberts Rules of Order, an abstention vote is counted as a yes. A blank vote is counted in the total but not as a yes or no. Thus, the motion to disaffiliate passed 86 %. Passage required a 66.6% affirmative vote.

The final official vote will take place at UMC Western PA Annual Conference on June 14, 2023 where all churches who have elected to leave the UMC will be affirmed and, when payment of all financial obligations are fulfilled, the action is then official.

Rich Ziegenfus explained at the close of the meeting that the Information Team, who worked diligently to research and bring to the congregation all sides of the progressive versus traditional UMC viewpoints in slides presented at the meetings, and in handouts and letters, will be re-organized into a Transition Team. Anyone interested in helping out on this team should contact a current team member.

The next step will be to bring to the congregation the result of research and exploration into pursuit of other Wesleyan-based denominations and other protestant denominations as well as the pros and cons of becoming an Independent Church.

A presentation of the results of that research and comparison study will be held at an Informational Meeting and Q&A session on May 3, 2023 in the sanctuary at 7pm. The information to be presented will compare various denominations on topics such as doctrine, property trust clause, how bishops and clergy are appointed and length of service, apportionments, current size and historical background.

A congregational vote will be held on May 10, 2023 at 7pm to determine which option to pursue.

Since this vote was not unanimous, we recognize there will be some among us who are unhappy about the new direction taken. We hope that you will find peace in whatever direction you feel you must take but know that you will always have a home at Heritage.

The Transition Team

For anyone wishing to remain a member of the United Methodist Church, you must move your membership to a church that is not disaffiliating before the vote is ratified at the June 14th annual conference. For questions on how to move your membership, contact the office.
