# Heritage family,

What is "the gospel?" That's a question that may be harder to answer than we think.

In the very fun movie *The Princess Bride,* one of the characters, Inigo Montoya repeatedly says, "You Keep Using That Word, I Do Not

Think It Means What You Think It Means." Maybe we could say the same about the use of the word, "gospel." Far too often, it means different things to different people.

During our October teaching series, we'll explore the core of the message of good news (gospel) about Jesus Christ that we in the Methodist tradition proclaim with a "Wesleyan accent." In a letter in response to someone asking about the content of the preaching of the early Methodist circuit riders, John Wesley boiled down the message of the gospel to four simple statements while also outlining the ways in which people are called to respond to that good news:

- God loves you, therefore love and obey God (September 30/October 1).
- Christ died for you, therefore die to sin (October 8).
- Christ rose again, therefore rise in the image of God (October 11 6:30pm).
- Christ lives evermore, therefore live for him until you live with him (October 22).



I look forward to seeing you in worship and invite you to bring a friend with you.



#### From the Finance Committee

Dear Heritage Brothers and Sisters,

For August, Heritage had a deficit of \$14,394 which has brought the year-to-date deficit to \$27,379. However, not all is lost. This year, there were several one -time costs related to the parsonage in getting it ready for Pastor Ron and Pastor Melissa. The Endowment Committee contributed \$10,000 to assist in offsetting some of these costs. In addition, campership reimbursement of \$1,341 will also be received in September. Both items will reduce but not eliminate the year-to-date shortfall. Also keep in mind, other non-routine maintenance costs related to the church and elevator were also incurred in August which further hampered the monthly results.

We have been experiencing inconsistent monthly giving. As an example, the monthly contributions for June, July and August were \$19,817, \$27,151 (5 **Sundays)** and \$16.747, respectively. We understand that these were summer months and with that, inconsistency is the norm. Weekly trends for September have been favorable and we expect to surpass our August numbers.

Through the generosity of our members our outstanding disaffiliation debt has been reduced to \$48,650.00. \$1,000 monthly payments will continue to be paid to reduce the principal and interest on the note.

As you can see, it is not all bad and we are making progress. However, we need to make more progress. Our monthly operating obligations are approximately \$25,000. Monthly contributions under this amount will add to the shortfall. Momentum is building and weekly attendance is growing. Please consider supporting Heritage even more as we work towards being debt free and having an operating surplus instead of deficits.


#### Thank You from Chuck Shaffer, Outreach
