#### Heritage family,

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas! The Diamond is beautifully decorated, and like you, I look forward to seeing all the lights on the houses around

town. For many reasons, this is the best time of the year.

Unfortunately, we live in a time when it's easier to focus on events that cause fear rather than the hope brought on by the coming of Jesus. Some of our fears are caused by events outside our control: inflation, war in the Ukraine and Israel, disruptive politics, personal health diagnosis, or family challenges. We fear the unknown. We fear a loss of control.

This is not new. People throughout history have lived through their fearful times. Even the New Testament records faithful people of God confronted by situations that had the potential to be filled with fear and uncertainty: angelic visits, political instability, unexpected pregnancy, and public ridicule. You are not alone!

The Scriptures of Advent and Christmas offer a unique perspective on how you and I can manage fearful situations. In the birth narratives of Luke and Matthew we encounter a familiar phrase: "Fear not!" This short phrase was always spoken when people were afraid. Our Advent messages will walk us through some of these passages but for now, let me offer this hope.

#### The presence of Jesus banishes fear!

This may seem too simple or trite for you. But I stand on the power of this promise. And so should you! The presence and power of Jesus is the antidote for whatever fear you are facing. Jesus is our God who promises peace. In Jesus, fear is replaced with confidence. His presence in your life is the power of God. Imagine how your fear will run away when the King of kings is the power and confidence that permeates your very soul! Do you remember when the disciples were caught in a great storm? Jesus comes to them and reveals that his presence calms all storms. Jesus even said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid" (Matthew 14:27).

Yes, there is plenty that we could be afraid of. But I encourage you to pray, "Jesus banish my fear by your powerful presence."

Join me during the Sundays of Advent and Christmas as we explore more of this promise.
