WHAT MAKES US UNIQUELY **METHODIST?** AND WHY SHOULD IT MATTER?

Did you know Methodists have 3 "Rules" to help us follow Jesus?

Here's this month's perspective on what makes us uniquely Methodist followers of Jesus, taken from the Global Methodist Church's Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline.

"The General Rules provide a helpful summation of the kind of intentional discipleship that marked early Methodism, summed up in three simple rubrics: do no harm, do good to all, and stay connected to the sacramental and devotional life of the church."

To facilitate this, Wesley created the practice of placing Methodists in small groups called classes. These small groups helped Methodist Christians live into the 3 Rules in the following wavs.

1. To see each person in a small group once a week in order: (1) to inquire how their souls prosper; (2) to advise, reprove, comfort, or exhort, as occasion may require.

2. To meet with the group leaders of the society once a week to inform them of any that are sick, or of any that walk disorderly and will not be reproved.

3. By attending upon all the ordinances of God; such are: The public worship of God. The ministry of the Word, either read or expounded. The Supper of the Lord. Family and private prayer. Searching the Scriptures. Fasting or abstinence.

These are the General Rules of our societies; all of which we are taught by God to observe, even in his written Word, which is the only rule, and the sufficient rule, both of our faith and practice. And all these we know his Spirit writes on truly awakened hearts."

You can see the emphasis John Wesley placed on small groups (classes) to help us follow Jesus. Here's the challenge for you and me: If I'm not already in a regular small group am I willing to take my next right step with Jesus and join one? When you're ready, let's talk.

June S.O.A.P. Readings
