Following 70 years in Babylonian exile, God's people began returning to Jerusalem. One of the early men God called to manage the return was Nehemiah. His responsibility was to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. He was called to ensure that God's people were well protected and could flourish in their homecoming. You can read this story in the Old Testament book of Nehemiah.

While there is much to discover in this book, one of the aspects I like to focus on is the value of rebuilding. The fortifications of Jerusalem needed rebuilding. This suggests that the walls had either been torn down or too damaged to be valuable anymore.

In a very real way, those of us who bravely jumped into the Global Methodist Church find ourselves rebuilding the Methodist movement. We're rebuilding from the local church up. The local church is the heartbeat of God's mission. Heritage is committed to the Global Methodist Church and its mission in the world. Locally we express our mission as *making disciples who know, follow, and share Jesus Christ.* This is the biblical foundation that we are building for ourselves and for all those who come after us. You are noticing early signs of this foundation being built. Some of you are participating and completely on board.

Here are three specific ways we are building a new foundation for the future.

We experience the Holy Spirit in worship. Our weekend worship will be deeper than tradition. We will create an atmosphere to experience the Spirit. Additionally, we are setting aside more time each month in *Revive* to worship and know Jesus, allowing him to transform us from the inside out.

We will build intentional spaces for discipleship to occur. We will follow Jesus with clarity and purpose. We're building the *University of the Holy Spirit* as a series of courses to reinforce the biblical basics for growing Jesus followers. We will continue to add small groups as the long-term landing spot for discipleship. The newest small group is *The Garrison* men's group. We will add more as the Holy Spirit opens doors. We intend to prioritize the Methodist model of discipleship.

We will encourage every member to serve in ministry and respond to God's call over their life. While we have several ministries available for you to serve, we will keep listening to the Holy Spirit for new ways of serving and sharing the Gospel. We are called to introduce people to Jesus in positive ways and this may include a specific focus on ministry to families.

We have been given an incredibly powerful and exciting opportunity as a Global Methodist congregation. No one is forcing us to do "church as normal" or to do things "we've always done." We are connected to a brand-new movement of God. Let's bravely respond to the mission of God and jump in!
