# Heritage Town Clock and Bell

While our current church was being built in 1902, a proposition was made to Rev. N.G. Miller, pastor of our church at the time, by a Pittsburgh firm to provide a town clock and bell to the borough at no cost by an anonymous donor.

On May 6th, 1903, the Town Clock and Bell began keeping time the at church. Electricity was turned on to light the north and east face of the clock. The E. Howard Clock and bell did not need electricity because it was a pendulum clock



which had to be wound once a week. The striking of the bell could be heard for three or four miles away so that it was an advantage to country people. Everyone in the borough knew what time of day it was day or night.

The anonymous donor's name was not revealed to the public until Rev. Miller retired. The Pittsburgh gentleman's name was Colonel James Guffey. It turns out Mr. Guffey and Pastor Miller were good friends and Mr. Guffey furnished the clock and bell in memory of his mother. Mr. Guffey was in the oil business and formed Gulf Oil in 1907. When Col. Guffey passed away at the age of 91 in 1930, the funeral service was held in Pittsburgh. While the service was being held, the bell at our church was rung 91 times.



The clock is listed in the Seth Thomas ledger with a date of August 9, 1902, serial #20/1124, according to the Smithsonian Institute Archives Center. The Town Clock and Bell have been maintained by the Ligonier Borough from May 6, 1903, until August 19, 2024. In August the Ligonier Borough decided they

the 1,000 lb. bell on the hour cannot prove ownership of the clock and bell and since the clock and bell are installed in our bell tower, we now own them. The bell, which had been turned off for several months, has been turned back on and both clock and bell are working well. The church plans to modernize the clock and bell in the future. Stay tuned for updates as plans are made available.
