# From the Pastor's Desk



Wouldn't it be great if we could go back through our lives and delete certain things? The moments we don't like, the embarrassing experiences, the painful memories? If only they could all disappear. Unfortunately, the sad reality is that we can't.

However, there is hope! And that's what Easter is all about—hope. Hope that comes from the empty cross. Jesus isn't there anymore! He's not dead; He's alive. He is our hope!

The empty cross proclaims, "I forgive you." God is saying this to you. One of the deep inner needs we have as human beings is to experience forgiveness and pardon.

A study conducted by the University of Iowa centered around people in therapy and focused on forgiveness. Of more than 1,000 participants, 75% reported a deep need and desire to forgive someone. That speaks truth! In my 30 years as a pastor, through counseling and conversations, I've learned that our deepest need as humans is to be forgiven and to forgive. If we can achieve this, I believe most of our issues will vanish.

I genuinely believe that if you want to experience real, deep, meaningful forgiveness, you first have to receive real, deep, meaningful, and lasting forgiveness. You can't give what you don't have!

You've probably heard the saying, "To err is human; to forgive is divine." Guess what? It's true. If you mess up regularly, welcome to the human race! But to forgive is divine. The empty cross of Jesus, if it conveys anything, is the Creator God saying, "I forgive you. I want you to experience my pardon. I'm ready to offer it to you. All you need to do is receive it."

I hope this Easter is the time when you give and receive the forgiveness you need.
