This is the point the Apostle Paul makes when he writes, "But now you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God. The benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life" (Romans 6:22).

The empty cross and the empty tomb make all the difference! You and I live in victory because of Jesus.
