For several days in June, I had the honor, along with your lay delegate Larry Barth, of attending the third gathering of the Allegheny West Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church.

These days of the annual conference included powerful worship driven by the Holy Spirit and inspiring teaching and preaching. What we experienced resembled the old-fashioned Methodist camp meetings and revivals. The days of mundane business are behind us! I am grateful to be part of this new movement, where we are intentionally reclaiming the Wesleyan tradition of holy conferencing.

This year, we ordained 43 individuals, saw over 90 people respond to a call to plant churches, and had more than 20 people respond to a call to ministry during the ordination service. We also collected over \$145,000 for the Miracle Offering that supports clergy education, elected delegates to represent the Allegheny West Conference at the 2026 General Conference in Johannesburg, and signed a covenant of agreement with the Kenya Annual Conference for future ministry partnership.

This new Methodist movement, of which we are a part, is heading in an exciting direction. We are recapturing sound biblical and Methodist doctrine while pursuing transformational worship empowered by the Holy Spirit's presence. This annual conference reminded us of what God wants to accomplish in all the churches, including Heritage, associated with the Global Methodist Church. Entering my third year as your pastor, I am committed to guiding us where the Holy Spirit leads. In the coming months, we will prioritize discipleship small groups, experiential worship, and intentional mission that connect us with the people of the Ligonier Valley who need to hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus.



#### Greetings Heritage,

It was both a privilege, and a pleasure, to serve as our church's lay delegate to the annual conference of the Allegheny West Conference of the Global Methodist Church, which took place June 18-21 at Mount Vernon Nazarene University in Mt Vernon, Ohio. Gathered together were lay delegates and clergy from Global Methodist churches throughout Ohio and Western Pennsylvania.

Linda and I arrived on Wednesday, in time to attend the evening worship service. The first verse of the opening song of praise started with the words, "I've still got joy in chaos; I've got peace that makes no sense..."

For me, these words rang true and set the tone for the holy conferencing which was to continue throughout our time together. We do indeed, live in a chaotic world that, at times, seems completely up-side-down and yet our faith enables us live in joy and abundance. As the tumult grows around us I am increasingly struck with how necessary it is to rely on God's wisdom and stead-fastness rather than our own understanding.

Throughout the conference I was impressed with the balance that seemed to be present in every circumstance. In all things, and at



all times, prayer, and the power of prayer, was a constant emphasis. Boldness was appropriately tempered with humility, seriousness was interspersed with humor. Legislation gave way to worship and teaching. There was a sense of what has already been accomplished in our still young denomination, but no sense of resting in that accomplishment. There is still much to do. It is exciting to see a scripture based, Christ centered church that is enthusiastic and growing.

Repeatedly during the conference, I found myself wishing that all of you, as members of Heritage Methodist Church, could have been there to have seen and felt, firsthand, what I was seeing and feeling. I believe that you would have been encouraged and reassured, as I was, in the leadership of our Allegheny West Conference and well pleased, as I am, to be part of the Global Methodist Denomination.

Of necessity, this is a brief overview of annual conference – my impressions rather than details. I look forward to talking with anyone who has a question or concern, or simply a desire to know more.
