From the Pastor...



As we continue to reflect on mental health and its relation to the Bible, we recognize that mental illness remains a highly stigmatized topic within the church. Charles Spurgeon once stated, "The mind can descend far lower than the body, for in it there are bottomless pits. The

flesh can bear only a certain number of wounds and no more, but the soul can bleed in ten thousand ways and die over and over again each hour."

The same biblical truths that have encouraged Christians for centuries can also encourage us now. Although we may struggle daily in the "bottomless pit" of the mind, we can hold on to four key encouragements:

You Are Not Alone. The people of God have faced suffering—mentally, emotionally, and physically—since the fall. Even Jesus himself cried out in despair on the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When we experience suffering, we are never alone. In addition, mental illness is likely more common than you realize. According to the National Institute of Mental Health, 1 in 5 American adults lives with a mental illness. You are almost certainly not the only one grappling with these challenges.

It's Not Your Fault. While mental illness is a result of the fallen world, my personal struggles—like the affliction of the man born blind (John 9:3)—are not punishments for my sins or the sins of my parents. Although mental illness may not be my fault, it can be an opportunity to speak about Christ's love. Of course, sin can exacerbate mental illness or provoke feelings of depression or anxiety. It is essential to have people who can point you to Christ, as sin spreads the infection of darkness. If we repent and refocus on Christ, we can allow the light—however dim it may seem—to enter our lives.

God Sees You and Is with You. We have a personal Savior who understands our emotions. As you endure the effects of mental illness, remember the closeness of Jesus. He weeps with you. He knows how He will work in and through your life, and He is present with you amid your suffering. By His grace, He has sent the Holy Spirit, our Comforter and Counselor, to be with you and to provide help.

God's Word Speaks to You. The Bible openly addresses mental and emotional anguish. For instance, look at Job or the Psalms—these are expressions of people crying out to God in despair. Most of these accounts end positively, reminding us of God's faithfulness.

Rejoice in the greatness and sovereignty of our mighty God. His grace is sufficient. Pray that God would reveal His strength in your moments of weakness.
